

The Buckingham Society has given the University of Buckingham Honorary Corporate Membership of the Society. This is in recognition of the great job that the University has done, and continues to do, in the restoration and conservation of the properties it owns in the historic parts of Buckingham.



In presenting the award, the Chair of the Buckingham Society, Roger Edwards commented on the “imaginative and dedicated work” that the University undertakes in looking after its property portfolio and the way it co-operates with the Society and the Town Council in enhancing the architecture of Buckingham.
